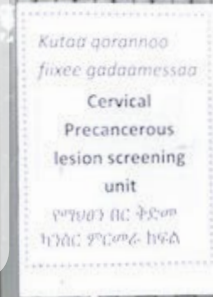


## Pink Ribbon Red Ribbon Ethiopia Partnership

Cardno manages U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) and the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief's (PEPFAR) Office of the U.S. Global AIDS Coordinator and Health Diplomacy (S/GAC) inputs to the Pink Ribbon Red Ribbon (PRRR) Ethiopia Partnership.



### Overview

The Pink Ribbon Red Ribbon (PRRR) partnership increases demand and access to quality cervical cancer screening and prevention services to women, especially those living with HIV/AIDS on ART, and receiving anti-retroviral therapy in Ethiopia. The target regions are Oromia Region, Southern Nations, Nationalities, and Peoples' Region, Harari Region, and Addis Ababa. The partnership's approach highly emphasizes community mobilization, which targets community health workers, Health Extension Workers, and ART Focal Persons with specialized training to ensure demand is created for services. Quality assurance, including MobileODT, on-the-job trainings, and refresher trainings, is a key part of the partnership's approach to ensure high quality services. In addition, the partnership supports the training of health workers to ensure visual inspection with acetic acid (VIA) screening, cryotherapy and Loop Electrosurgical Excision Procedure (LEEP) screening and treatment services are available to 19,000 at-risk women at 22 additional health facilities. Grounds for Health and Pathfinder are the implementing partners.

## Path to Ending Cervical Cancer

In early 2018, PEPFAR reassessed its cervical cancer prevention strategy in collaboration with PRRR, evaluating progress made over the past five years and assessing the gaps. HIV-positive women were identified as the highest risk, so PEPFAR has developed an age-band appropriate, comprehensive strategy to reduce cervical cancer risk by 95% in HIV-positive women by every-other-year cervical cancer screening for HIV-positive women over age 30 and human papilloma virus (HPV) vaccination in younger girls and women living with HIV. This strategy creates a pathway to ending cervical cancer in HIV-positive women at scale.
